Klingberg has been appointed chairman of the Centrex Metals Board.

Mr Klingberg was elected at the company's AGM on January 21 after serving as a non-executive director of the company since 2005.

His experience is diverse with roles ranging from corporate chairman to Chancellor of the University of South Australia, an appointment he retired from in 2008 after 10 years of service. His other credits are numerous and include director of Coadn Limited and E&A Limited, chairman of the Premier's Climate Change Council and chairman of the Leader's Institute of SA.

Mr Klingberg's appointment comes just after the retirement of company director David Lindh. Centrex Metals will look for two directors with mining experience to head the board.



Wind desalination developer Windesal has appointed **Hemant Chaudhary** as chief technology officer – a newly created position at the company.

Mr Chaudhary is an environmental and civil engineer with more than 20 years' experience working on environmental projects in SA. A highlight is his involvement with the City of Salisbury's stormwater aquifer storage-and-supply scheme which has been internationally recognised.

Windesal is developing wind-powered desalination plants based on technology from Denmark. The company aims to turn seawater and groundwater into drinking water.

Its first major project will be in partnership with the City of Salisbury to develop a plan for a \$20 million plant in the region.
