Water firm in \$20m plunge

AFTER 20 years in space technology and satellite communications, **Jonathan Whalley** is taking a fresh plunge.

He will lead Adelaide water company Windesal's push to establish a \$20 million plant in Salisbury and help advance its innovative plans as its new chief executive.

The former electrical engineer – most recently founder and director of satellite modem vendor DSpace – will oversee the Adelaide-based company's Australian and overseas operations.

Windesal is developing wind-powered desalination plants using Danish technology, to turn seawater and brackish groundwater into high-quality potable water.

“Windesal is set to

play a crucial role in solving the world's water shortage, so this is an incredibly exciting opportunity to lead such a forward-thinking organisation with overtly green values,” said Mr Whalley.

Windesal is currently working with the City of Salisbury, to tap into the region's large underground aquifers, which have been enhanced by the council's stormwater recycling program.
